Jane's Walks are held in over 200 cities worldwide and are named after Jane Jacobs who was a pioneer in protecting urban neighborhoods. Her 1961 book, The Death and Life of Great American Cities, is a classic and was a wakeup call for many to protect and save their neighborhood. Jane's Walks are held in early May to celebrate her birthday and urban neighborhoods.

Albuquerque's first Jane's Walks were held in 2021 as self-quided walks. Future Jane's Walks celebrations will be a combination of volunteerled and self-quided walks. All of the Albuquerque Jane's Walks take place in the city's older and more walkable neighborhoods.

Mountain Road Cultural Arts District

This Jane's Walk begins and ends in front of Ricochet Gallery on the southwest corner of Mountain Road and 11th Street, and highlights the art and architecture on or near Mountain Road. The walk takes you through some of Albuquerque's oldest and nicest neighborhoods near Downtown. Along the way you'll see wonderful artwork, interesting streets, and the best of neighborhood living.


